REVIEWED CORE POLICIES:	Many of our core policies have recently been reviewed. These are shared with parents when children start school. They will be reissued by email in the coming days. For ease of access these policies are available on our school website and paper copies are available in the school foyer.
FRIENDS OF ST MARY'S:	We are always looking for enthusiastic parents to join the Friends of St Mary's. It's a wonderful way to be involved in the school community and help us organise fun events for the children. We have added a button on the school website, to make it easier for parents to express an interest in joining the group, or parents can always contact Sarah directly.

Thank-you to parents for supporting our school uniform policy, by ensuring that your child wears <b>plain navy bottoms</b> . We try to keep uniform costs to a minimum, in keeping with DE Guidance. We do not require an additional PE uniform and parents are welcome to purchase plain polo shirts, trousers, skirts etc from any store for a reasonable price. Only the sweater must bear the logo. Following this simple uniform code is part of respecting the rules of our school and should be adhered to as such. Please note that children should bring a coat and it is not appropriate to wear shorts, in cold weather.
We have devised a 'Walking to and from School Policy, to formalise the unwritten policy which had been in place. This will also be emailed to parents in the coming days. A core element of this policy is that <b>P1 and 2 pupils should be accompanied by an adult.</b> <b>There is a strong recommendation that P3 children are,</b> but we acknowledge that in exceptional circumstances P3s may walk with a designated P6 or 7 pupil. There is a form included in the policy, which parents should complete if they wish there P3 to walk with an older child.
We do not currently have safe access to the school site to allow pupils to enter and exit on bicycles. We therefore ask that pupils do not travel to and from school on bicycles at <b>present</b> . We do however want to promote active travel and will arrange designated days during the school year when additional supervision will be in place to accommodate children safely entering the school on bicycles.
I want to reinforce our commitment to creating a safe and nurturing environment for every child. We have been actively addressing the issue of bullying and fostering kindness and understanding. The children particularly enjoyed the many extra cross-curricular lesson which have been linked to Anti-Bullying Week, such as the most recent Art Therapy Workshops for P3-7, funded by the Friends of St Mary's. As usual there was a very high standard in our Addressing Bullying Poster Competition, well done to the winners in each class. Thank-you also to those who completed our recent parent consultation through the school website. We assure all parents that in keeping with our policy, <b>extensive</b> <b>preventative measures are in place throughout the school year, there are clear</b> <b>procedures which are followed when bullying behaviour is suspected and if school</b> <b>have concerns that your child is being bullied, we will inform you.</b>

CHRISTMAS PREPARATIONS: The festive season is nearly upon us, and our school will soon start to buzz with excitement! We will be busy over the coming weeks, exploring the story of Christmas, rehearsing for our Christmas Carol Service, holding our traditional internal postal service and preparing for our traditional Christmas dinner. This year the School Council have selected the Cancer Fund for Children as their designated Charity. We ask that everyone brings £1 for this cause on Christmas Dinner Day. Children are invited to wear a Christmas Jumper to school that day. Following the success of our Halloween Costume Swap, we invite children to bring in unwanted Christmas Jumpers to swap on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November.
